






Our Number

AfriLabs was founded in 2011 with 5 hubs from across four African countries. It has grown to over 150 hubs across 40 African countries in 2019.







Catalyst Program

The Catalyst Program is a cross-stakeholder initiative of AfriLabs in conjunction with (African Business Angels Network) ABAN that aims to strengthen entrepreneurs and startups, hubs and angel investors, while delivering impact results to institutional funders.

The Catalyst Program raises funds (debt or grant) from various institutional partners to add to a pool. This pool serves as a matching or co-investment fund to encourage investment in viable AfriLabs-affiliated startups by verified angel investors. The criteria for accessing fund from this pool are as follows.

- Affiliation with hubs that are members of the AfriLabs Network. These hubs will help to administer and track use/impact of the investments.
- Offer of investment from investors affiliated to angel networks that are members of ABAN.

These investors are encouraged to invest because their investment is doubled/matched and hubs help to track/monitor their investment.

The success of this initiative will lead to:

- More African startups that are better funded and are better monitored
- Hubs that are able to attract and retain quality startups and a viable hub sustainability model
- Angel investors who are able to invest in a larger portfolio, de-risked significantly by the monitoring and reporting from the hubs
- Better visibility, transparency and objective impact reporting for the funders.
- Overall stronger, more sustainable African startup ecosystem.

Developing skills of African youth, leveraging on hubs as learning centers of excellence while also driving employment and jobs for the future.



The Hub Academy is an initiative of AfriLabs in partnership with Liquid Telecom. It aims to provide a learning platform that offers training and upskilling support to AfriLabs member hubs (to be known as Learning Centers) and their communities. The academy aims to train 10,000 students within 2 years.

Courses offered will be relevant and updated materials in the areas of technology, innovation, entrepreneurship, business development and other areas as deemed useful for the audience.

Across all available courses, learners will be able to obtain/purchase a certificate upon completion, demonstrating the learner's proficiency in this area.






Hubs Learning Week




